

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

2016 was my last year

We have accomplished a lot in five years at PCR. To begin, we have made changes to our horseman's camping area on Indian Hill. We have added 10 new electric and water campsites and 9 new hitching rails. With the help of the Muncie Lighthouse Club, we have brought in 140 ton of gravel to maintain the horse trails. Thanks to the club for providing the extra manpower needed to continue to maintain our trails. Overall in our campground areas, in the last 5 years we have added 100 new picnic tables, bought 50 fire rings, and upgraded our electrical system in the main campground area. In years past we have had outages and issues with loss of voltage to campsites. This has since been fixed by installing a new electrical junction building to separate the power to bring in a larger amount of service to the campground. We have added 5 rental cabins. We have upgraded a total of 13 campsites from primitive to water and electric. We have added an additional 8 permanent seasonal campsites. The campground bathrooms also received some updating by painting and replacing shower faucets.

To try to improve security at the campground, we have added a guard shack at the entrance equipped with video surveillance. For entertainment for our campers and beach goers, we have purchased a speaker system to host movie nights and karaoke. This has been very popular; as we have had over 200 people attend movies at the campground. Thanks to Muncie Parks and Recreation, they had some playground equipment that we could repurpose and add to our campground area.

We have also updated our playgrounds and shelters. The Campground Shelter and Rock Shelter have been replaced. We have added electricity and lights to Shelter 1 and Shelter 2. We added 2 semi

loads of mulch to our playgrounds by the beach and in the campground.

Our beach area is one of our major upgrades as well. We have replaced the bathhouse facilities. We have added new lifeguard stands and brought lifeguards to the beach. This has been very beneficial, as there has been several saves made by our lifeguards. We have also added 9 paved, handicap parking spots and 2 trampolines for activities in the water.

Other improvements to PCR include painting of all outhouses, we created 2 miles of multi-use trails on the south side of the reservoir, and partially paved the walking trail at the beach playground area. We have also brought in several tons of gravel to repair the roads throughout the park. Also, with the help of DNR, we have been restocking the reservoir with an average of 68,000 to 72,000 walleye every year since 2000 and is still continuing.

PRAIRIE CREEK CAMPGROUND

2017 CAMPING / CABIN RULES

1. The campground fee is to be paid in advance of set up. **Groups are allowed one camper and one tent OR two tents per site. No more than 8 people per campsite. Cabin rentals are restricted to no more than 6 adults**
2. **Check out time is 12:00 pm, Check in is at 3:00 pm.**
3. One responsible individual 18 years or older is required to register personally for his/her group or family with the Park Office. Campers under 18 years must be accompanied by an adult.
4. **Refunds will be given only in unusual circumstances such as serious injury or accident.** Rain, cold, or inclement weather is not a valid reason to make a refund. Contact the Park Office. Refund is at the Park Superintendent's discretion.
5. The receipt issued by the Park must be retained by the customer
6. **Daily Campers / Cabin Rentals are limited to a period not to exceed 14 consecutive days.** After 14 days, the group must completely vacate the campsite / cabin for a minimum period of 48 hours.
7. Any firewood kept at campsites / cabins must be kept in a neat stack no larger than 8', no higher than 4' and no wider than 4'. **NO ASH TREE WOOD ALLOWED.**
8. **No charcoal or gas grills allowed inside cabins. A charcoal grill will be provided near your cabin.**
9. Campers may request a specific site if available. 1 site change per customer is permitted if sites are available. Reservations or changes can be made in the Park Office.
10. **HOLIDAY RESERVATIONS MUST BE AT LEAST 3 NIGHTS, NO EXCEPTIONS.** Payment must be received 2 weeks prior to reservation date if it falls on a holiday weekend.
11. No firearms or bow / arrows are allowed. Park's Code 95.04 states no firearms allowed in Parks.
12. **Fireworks are prohibited in the campground at all times.** This includes "sparklers"
13. **ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MUST BE KEPT AT THE CAMPSITE / CABIN AND IN A CONCEALED CONTAINER.**
14. No mopeds, dirt bikes, 4-wheelers, or other like motorized vehicles allowed. **Speed limit is 10 MPH for all authorized vehicles.**
15. No more than 2 golf carts will be allowed per campsite / cabin and they must be registered at the Park Office prior to being brought into the campground. **There will be a \$25 per year fee or \$5 per day fee per golf cart. No person under the age of 16 years old will be allowed to operate a golf cart on Park property.** Any golf cart being used after dark must be equipped with lights. **Daily Campers / Cabin Renters who have golf carts must also pay the golf cart fees.** Annual Golf Cart Permit Sticker must be placed on the front of the cart.
16. **ABSOLUTLEY NO PETS ARE ALLOWED IN THE CABINS!** RV and Tent campers: **Dogs, cats or other pets must be on a leash and be attended at all times.** No fenced dog kennels are allowed at campsite. Portable kennels only. Those at campsite are responsible for cleaning up after pet anywhere in campground.
17. The washing of dishes or pets at drinking fountains or lavatories is prohibited. Washing of automobiles, boats or campers in the camping area is prohibited.
18. All refuse and garbage is to be placed in receptacles provided for that purpose.
19. Horses will not be permitted in the campgrounds or any undesignated Park property.
20. Pontoon piers are rented by private individuals. Piers and watercraft docked there are restricted to owners only. **Piers and watercraft are strictly OFF LIMITS to anyone other than the owners.**
21. **No overnight parking of pontoons and/or trailers in the campground.**

22. No type of business can be operated on a campground site. No workshops on campsites. No campground utilities be used for any type of business. **Advertising for personal gain is not allowed.**
23. **Fires must be contained to fire rings or fire pits**, no fires can be started in any grassy area. Fires shall be entirely extinguished immediately after use. Lighted matches, cigarettes, cigars or other articles afire shall be extinguished before being discarded. The Parks Department authorized representative may prohibit all fires in any area when deemed necessary. **There will be NO SMOKING allowed in any Cabin, Park restroom, or shower house facility.**
24. **Quiet hours shall be observed from 11 pm to 7 am.** Campers are to be respectful of others around them. Abusive language, encroachment on other visitor's property, ignoring quiet hours, or drunken and disorderly conduct will not be tolerated. First offense verbal warning, second offense will result in the loss of your campsite / cabin and being ordered to leave the Park area.
25. It shall be unlawful to locate any camp, tent, trailer, truck camper, van or motor home at any place except as specifically provided, designated, or assigned. It shall be unlawful to leave any camp, tent, trailer, truck camper, van or motor home at any designated or assigned place for a longer period of time than specified. It shall be unlawful to sleep in or occupy between 11 pm and 6 am, any camp tent, trailer, truck camper, van or motor home or other vehicle in any area other than those specifically designated or assigned except as authorized by written permit from the Parks Department or its authorized representative.
26. It shall be unlawful to injure, cut, destroy, remove, mutilate, or deface any building, structure, pontoon dock, watercraft, sign, rock, tree, shrub, vine or property whatsoever, nor picking of flowers, nor take, molest, or rifle the nest of any bird, or den, or abode, of any wild animal on land owned licensed or leased to the Park Department or Indiana American Water Co.
27. **Campers / Cabin Renters will abide by all rules and ordinances set by the City of Muncie and Muncie Park and Recreations Board or face expulsion from Park property without a refund.**

Seasonal Regulations

1. The only type of frame work allowed in the campground will be a canopy that can be no bigger than 10 feet by 20 feet. Can only have a top and no sides, and cannot obstruct the view of any other camper. **ONE PER SITE!**
2. **Lights cannot be strung from tree to tree or camper to tree.** Extension cords can only be plugged into electrical outlets on your campsite. The electric service at your camp site is for your camper only. No swings hanging from trees.
3. The only privacy fences allowed will be fences around the tongue of trailers. There can be no other fences anywhere else on campsite.
4. Campers are allowed portable decks and small storage units. Any decks or storage buildings must be maintained neatly. Decks can be no bigger than 12' X 12'. Storage units 5' X 3' X 2'. **NO CEMENT.** Must be portable.
5. Absolutely no sun decks or any other structure up above or over the camper or site will be allowed.
6. **No refrigerators will be allowed on the outside of a camper.**
7. No addition to your campsite can infringe on the campsites surrounding yours.
8. **No subleasing your campsite**
9. You must completely vacate your site at the end of the season, or pay a storage fee to leave your camper during the winter. Decks, woodpiles, and other possessions must be removed if no storage fee is paid.
10. Address and/or Phone Number changes must be reported to park office to keep records up to date.
11. All Camper Transfers, Switches, Selling/Purchasing **Must** be approved by the Superintendent.
12. All Campsite Transfers **Must** have both party's present at Park Office to complete the Transfer Form.

PRAIRIE CREEK PARK

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All motor boats must have CURRENT registration numbers and stickers
 - a. Boat operators must possess a valid driver's license
 - b. One USCG approved wearable personal flotation device is required for each person on board.
 - c. Boats longer than 16 feet (except canoes and kayaks) must have a USCG approved Type IV "throw able" PFD on board.
2. The speed limit at Prairie Creek Reservoir is 20 mph. The hours between sunset and sunrise, the speed limit is reduced to 10 mph. "Idle speed" only within 200 feet of the bank.
 - a. No limit on Motor Size / Horsepower
3. Tubing is allowed SOUTH of Huffman Creek ONLY!
 - a. Absolutely NO Jet Ski's or Water Skiing
 - b. Tubing requires at least three people: The driver, the spotter, and the person tubing
 - c. Wakeboarding/Knee Boarding are permitted in the tubing area (20 mph still applies)
4. Fishermen under the age of 18 or born before April 1, 1943 do not need a fishing license. All others must purchase a state fishing license from the Department of Natural Resources.
 - a. These can be purchased online (www.in.gov/dnr), at most sporting goods stores, or at the Lighthouse Bait Shop.
5. Boats and pontoons can be rented at Dry Dock Marina (765-286-4976)
6. The piers at Prairie Creek are leased to Pier Holders ONLY! All others are trespassing.
7. Trot Lines and limb lines are not permitted
8. A daily or yearly permit must be purchased for bank fishing or boat launching
 - a. These can be purchased during business hours at the Park Office
 - b. After hours: Use the "Self Check-In" on the east side of the Park Office
9. The ATV trails are open during daylight hours. No street licensed vehicles are allowed on the trails (No Jeeps, trucks, etc).
 - a. A permit (daily or yearly) is required to use the trails. The permit can be purchased at the Park Office. A Liability Waiver must also be signed by all ATV trail users.
 - b. All vehicles must have current registration through the BMV
10. Swimming is ONLY allowed at the beach and ONLY when a lifeguard is present.

Indian Hill Horse Facility Rules and Regulations

Prairie Creek Office/ Security: 747-4776/747-4872

Non-Emergency MPD: 747-4838

1. **All riding is AT YOUR OWN RISK.**
2. **Riding permits are required** to use the Prairie Creek trails. Purchase at park office on east side of reservoir. \$25 yearly; \$5 daily; \$10 per night primitive camping
3. The trails are for equine use only. **No motorized vehicles or bicycles allowed.**
4. Riders must stay in designated riding areas. Stay on marked trails. No bushwhacking. No rough riding or racing on grounds.
5. Day riders may tie to trailer or hitching rails. Campers **MUST** use hitching rails, picket lines or portable corrals. **NO TYING TO TREES.**
6. Overnight camping (primitive) is allowed with permit purchased at Prairie Creek office. \$10 per night. Each vehicle/trailer combination and/or guest vehicle must have a permit. **You must have horses or be guests of campers that do to camp at this facility.** Other non-horse vehicle parking (camper or guest) cannot block hitching rails.
7. If there is not a toilet on the grounds provided by the park, all campers must have self-contained toilet facilities. **You cannot camp without a toilet.** Drinking water for you and your horse is provided by on site well.
8. All camp fires must be in fire rings. Extinguish all fires before leaving. No Ash wood allowed. Firewood must be clean, natural, sawn wood. No painted stained or treated wood allowed. **Wood cannot contain any metal fasteners or any noncombustible materials.**
9. All garbage/trash is to be picked up and placed in trash barrels. **Do not burn trash in camp fires.**
10. Clean site before leaving. **Spread horse manure in tree line or haul off grounds.**
11. Dogs, cats, or other pets must be on a leash. You are responsible for cleaning up after pet anywhere on grounds.
12. No firearms or bow and arrows are allowed. No hunting anywhere on Prairie Creek grounds.
13. Fireworks are prohibited on the grounds at all times.
14. It shall be unlawful to injure, cut, destroy, remove, mutilate, **or deface any building, structure, sign, or cable boundary fence**, rock, tree, shrub, vine, or property whatsoever, nor pick any flowers, nor take, molest, or rifle the nest of any bird, or den, or abode, of any wild animal on land owned licensed, or leased to the Park Department or Indiana-American Water Co.
15. Exercise courteous behavior in all areas of the grounds. Users are to be respectful to others around them. Abusive language, encroachment on other user's sites, ignoring quiet hours, or drunken and disorderly conduct will not be tolerated.


