

6.0 STATION 6

The facility was built in the 1950's and underwent a renovation in 1993. The station is a split-level house that has had apparatus bays constructed to the north end of the structure. The station is located within McCulloch Park and has a single lane drive to the rear of the structure. The station has 3 bays with 2 of the bays being drive through. These bays are 45' x 18' each and are heated with radiant heaters. The third bay is not a drive through and accessible from the front only. The bay doors measure 14' wide and 16' high that is adequate for apparatus.

This station provides men and women's bunkroom facilities. The smaller quarters has a restroom with a water closet and 1 lavatory and 1 shower. The larger quarters has a restroom with 2 showers and 2 water closets and lavatories. The basement contains the kitchen and recreational room. The kitchen measures approximately 15' x 15' with a residential range and hood and there is ample storage space within the station. The recreational room is approximately 15' x 15' and contains a game table and workout area.

6.1 APPARATUS AND PERSONNEL HOUSED AT STATION

The station has a Quint unit that is staffed with three personnel at the current time. There is no other apparatus housed out of the station at this time.

6.2 MAJOR DEFICIENCIES NOTED

Of the existing stations within the department this facility offers the most room and space both for apparatus and personnel. The station is located within a city park and if additional ground would be needed in the future for expansion this should not pose a problem. The ability to meet ADA requirements should be addressed to prevent possible future legal problems.
